

## School Rules & Waiuku Way Expectations (11 added)

### 5.2

#### Rationale

A condition of enrolment is that the student and parents/caregivers accept that the school rules and Waiuku Way expectations apply while students are at school, at school functions or on the way to and from school.

#### Requirements

1. Uniform is compulsory for all but Year 13 students. It is expected to be worn tidily and must be worn in full on the way to and from, as well as at school. Uniform regulations are published annually on the school website and the information is provided with the enrolment pack. Year 13 must adhere to their Dress Code as outlined at the end of their Year 12.
2. Students may not smoke, nor consume alcohol, nor any drug at school, or at school functions, on school buses, nor at any time on the way to or from school or school functions. They may also not possess any substances or equipment related to the above.
3. No explosive matter, matches, lighters or dangerous substances or weapons are to be brought into school.
4. Students are restricted from certain areas of the school at certain times under the Out of Bounds rules. These are to be communicated to students at the start of each school year.
5. All cyclists are required to wear an approved helmet on the way to and from school.
6. Damage to school property is to be reported immediately. The repair of damage is undertaken by the school. Where damage is the result of carelessness, mischief, or the disobeying of school rules, students and parents/caregivers may be expected to pay all or part of the cost.
7. In addition to these specified rules, students are required to obey any other rules as laid down from time to time by the Principal and staff.
8. All students are expected to adhere to the rules, rights and responsibilities outlined in Policy 5.17 Student Safety and Policy 5.12 Cybersafety.
9. The **Waiuku Way Expectations** will reflect the school values of Pride, Respect and Safety and be communicated to students each year for the different scenarios in which they apply. They could cover expectations areas and scenarios such as:

The Classroom	The I-Hub/Library	The Gymnasium	Bus Users
The School Assembly Hall	The School Quad and Footpaths	Sports Representation	

Student input will be taken into account in the application of Waiuku Way expectations. Digital and printed signage will be used to reinforce Waiuku Way expectations.
10. Mobile phones. Students may bring mobile phones to school. They must not be seen heard or used in class time unless specifically permitted by the teacher. e.g. use of phone camera for recording images or video for class purposes.
11. Smoking paraphernalia (including vaping devices) can be confiscated and held by the school until collected by parents\caregivers or given to the police if of an illegal nature.
